

Simple As It Is – Then who is complicating it and why?

The United States Constitution was drafted to be a straightforward document contained in 4 pages, to capture the colonists' intent in its core principles and structure. Citizens are the highest power in the land, with the Constitutional system to be operated solely for and on behalf of the people. It's not complicated.

"I know no safe depository of the ultimate powers of society but the people themselves; and if we think them not enlightened enough to exercise their control with a wholesome discretion, the remedy is not to take it from them, but to inform their discretion by education." - Thomas Jefferson, Letter to W. C. Jarvis, September 28, 1820

This principle is echoed exactly by Nobel Prize winner Milton Friedman in his conversation regarding the role of [citizens and government in the United States](#).

There is no way the colonists wanted a Constitution that creates kings, queens, entitled royalty, absolute masters, despots, or tyrants by any means, religions to threaten, belittle, abuse or rebuke citizens, people claiming they were chosen by some god to rule over them, or for people of color to be told they are sub human and intended to be slaves. Nor did the colonists intend to give bankers and corporations power over them to debank, defund, sanction, financially manipulate, control or threaten them with their own money.

In addition, when George Washington penned his famous Farewell Address of 1796, he asked his Revolutionary War comrade Alexander Hamilton to edit the speech. Hamilton crystallized the *president's sentiment against foreign entanglements* — then shared by most — into the "Great Rule."

"Interweaving our destiny" with others, Washington and Hamilton argued, would "entangle our peace and prosperity in the toils of European ambition, rivalry, interest, humor or caprice." America should therefore pursue economic integration with the world, but maintain strict neutrality in its feuds.

John Quincy Adams reiterated this principle on July 4, 1821, when he reminded Congress that America **"goes not abroad, in search of monsters to destroy. She is the well-wisher to the freedom and independence of all. She is the champion and vindicator only of her own."**

Citizens of the United States are the absolute rulers and authority of the nation, who may at their option and sole and total discretion, which may be withdrawn at any time, chose to appoint or elect functionaries as servants to carry out functions and duties on their behalf. Citizens also have the supreme and unquestionable authority to decide all matters in law, and that their decisions are unchallengeable.

Having said that, how is it that citizens have been conned into putting up with the functionary's behavior we now see? Citizens have every right to step up and force a complete return to their original intent of the Constitution. I have grave doubt that will be accomplished through discussion. As for comments from England and Europeans, they are provable losers who never could create a system like the colonists have and should be relegated to the dustbin of history.

Let them puff themselves up and be indignant, just look at the mess they are in to know they never got what the colonies stood for and why. Jefferson stated at the end of the day, after all remedies fail, we can shoot them if they get out of line! Where in the Constitution does it say the functionaries are the masters and we can't kick their ass out the door?

As jurors we can override any legal deal they make. There is no provision in the Constitution that says we are stuck with their stupidity.

1. Trial by Jury: The Sixth Amendment to the Constitution guarantees the right to a trial by jury in all criminal cases, and the Seventh Amendment guarantees the right to a trial

by jury in all civil cases over \$20 in value. This includes the power of jurors to judge both the law and the facts.

2. Jury Independence: The Seventh Amendment ALSO ensures that jurors are not subject to coercion or intimidation by judges, prosecutors, or other authorities and that the decision of the jury cannot be re-examined.

How is it possible that government employment is some kind of inviolate right with ridiculous pensions awarded to these people, including allowing them to work from home on our nickel. And we cannot reverse it and if they sue us, we tell them to go fuck themselves. Remember it's our money and we are the bosses.

How is it that corporations are considered people in law with all the privileges of people.
